

Wild about wildlife







Animal furs are also called **pelts and hides**. Inside these boxes are 4 pelts from wild animals that you can see in Scotland.

Feel the pelt inside each box. Try to work out which animal each pelt comes from.


	Pine marten	Box

Hint: think about the size of the pelt, is it taken from a large or small animal? Feel for something obvious like a tail.



Spotting and identifying the tracks that animals leave behind is a great way to learn about the animals living around you.


Use the key to match the animal to it's print.








Listen to the sound clip and read the description of 4 animal sounds. Can you match the sounds you hear to each animal?

Dropping Hints...




Animal droppings are called scat. By looking for and identifying the scat we can learn which wild animals are living in your area. Experts can often tell the type of animal from the smell of the scat. How good is your nose? What can you smell?
