

Early connections Wild about Rain gardens

Purpose

This document is a lesson plan for the Early Connections workshops series which connects children to nature through a mix of indoor and outdoor sessions. Workshops are aim to children aged 8-12 years in P5-7. Wild about rain gardens will explain what a rain garden is, why it is needed and explore the conceptual design of a rain garden which would be suitable for the school.

Each session is 45-60 minutes long.
