

Make a Bumblebee from loo roll



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Materials you'll need

This is a great activity that will use up all of those empty toilet rolls.

A toilet roll inner
Scissors and a responsible adult
PVA/glue stick or Sellotape
Paints/pens/pencils for decorating
Card or paper –recycle an old cereal box!



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What do I do with them?

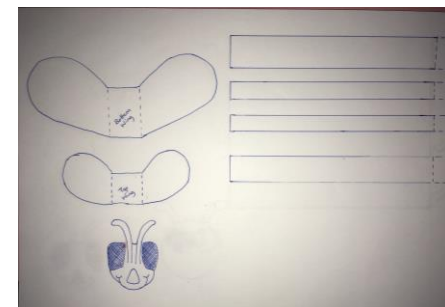
Take a loo roll inner and colour it in with paints/pens or pencils. We have made a tree bumblebee, what type of bee will your be?



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Making the body of the bumblebee

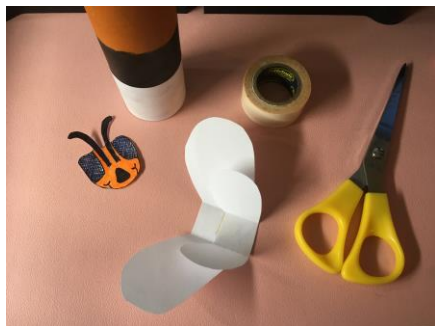
Print page 2 of this activity on a separate sheet of paper and colour in the face. The wings should be white and the stripes can either be cut out and stuck onto the roll or drawn on.



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Cut it out!

Time to cut out the stripes, wings and face, ask an adult for help! When cutting out the stripes leave a little extra to overlap on the roll.



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Putting it all together

Stick the smaller wings on top of the larger wings as bumblebees have 4 wings cool eh! She looks like such a happy bee.



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All done

Finish up by sticking the wings on the back. You can now name your bumblebee friend and add them to your collection.

Great job!



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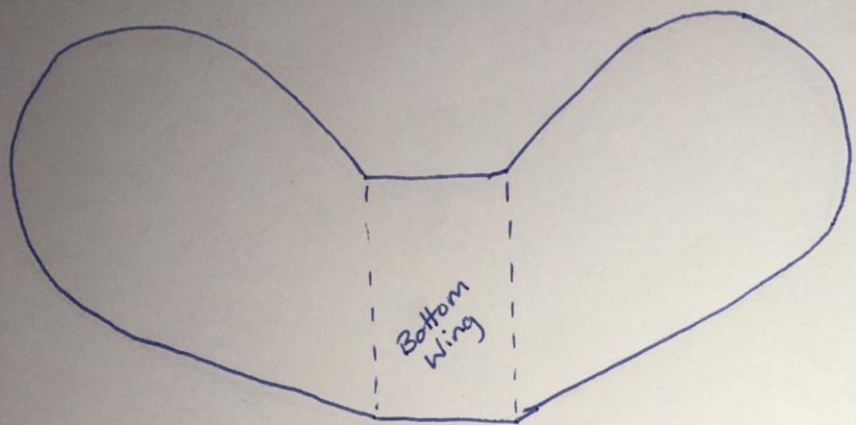
